GLOWM – *The Global Library of Women’s Medicine*

Overview

The Global Library of Women’s Medicine (GLOWM) is published on a not-for-profit basis by The Foundation for The Global Library of Women’s Medicine. Its sole purpose is to offer a minor contribution to the enhancement of women’s healthcare around the world.

It was founded, launched and initially funded by David and Paula Bloomer in memory of their daughter, Abigail.

In 2007 AMA DataSet were commissioned by GLOWM to convert a series of articles that had previously been available as a CD to a full online website as a free resource. The article content needed to be updated and peer reviewed to bring it fully up to date. An online editing system was created to allow the articles to be edited and reviewed. A website was also created to give open access to the articles.

Since this time, the website has gone through several iterations into the system in use today. In 2020 GLOWM commissioned a new editorial system for the creation and update of their new online publication *The Continuous Textbook of Women’s Medicine*. The new content is constantly being updated and added to the new restyled website Welfare of Women Global Health Programme. The bespoke website includes a display of medical articles full cloud resources such as pdf, video and images.

Other work AMA has carried out for GLOWM is the typesetting of their printed and online publications. Creation of offline versions of the website on CD and memory stick to be distributed where internet connection is either poor or not available. A women’s medicine app for use by midwives and other medical professionals. A CPD administration system with automated PDF certificate generation and api system.



INTRODUCTION

Contemporary formalized birth systems vary greatly across the world, expressing underlying national or regional political, economic and cultural variations. The roots of the oldest of contemporary birth systems lie in the emergence of modern states and their often pronatalist population policies. 'Pronatalism' in social policy refers to measures intended to stimulate a higher birth rate in the interest of the nation. Maternity policies were among the first social policies that early welfare states launched in Northern Europe and North America under governments that wanted to improve children's and mothers' chances for survival and, more recently, increase the birth rate.^{1,2} Non-health measures included modest maternity benefits that lowered the cost of birth services and perhaps even compensation for lost income during the postpartum period. Most importantly from a contemporary perspective early maternity policies formalized maternity care service provision through regulation, state subsidies or compulsory insurance schemes.³

On a global perspective, these developments were largely limited to high-income countries. Most affluent countries, with

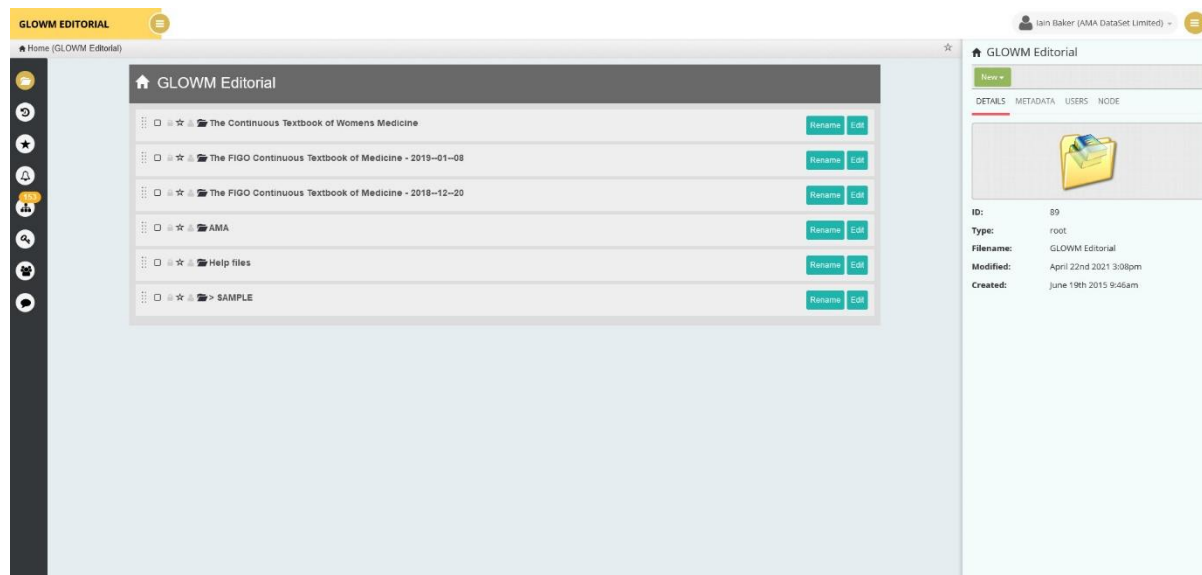

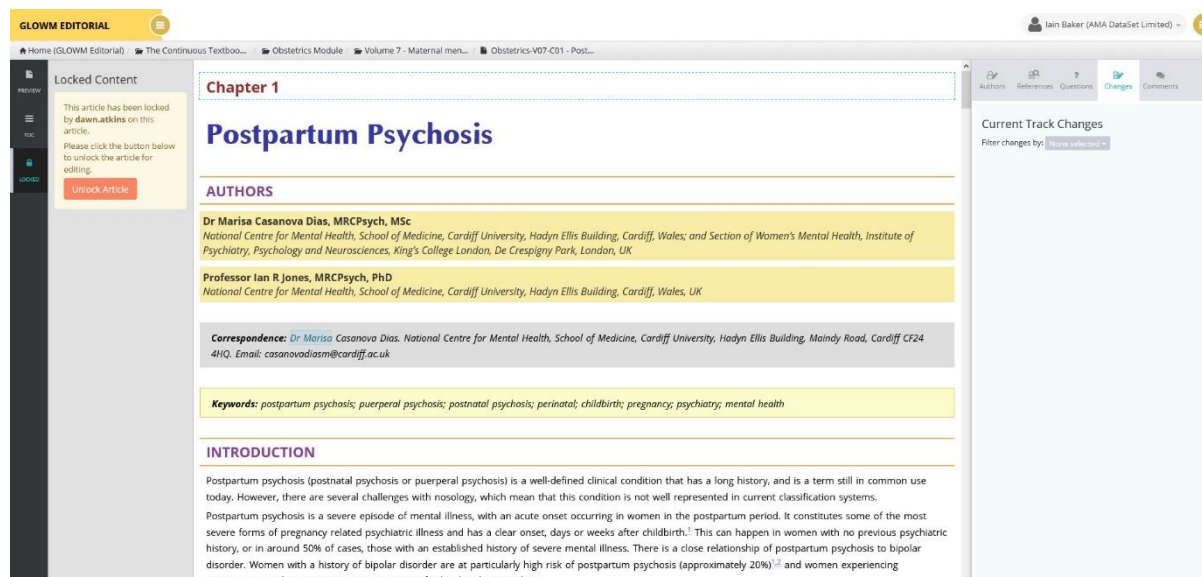

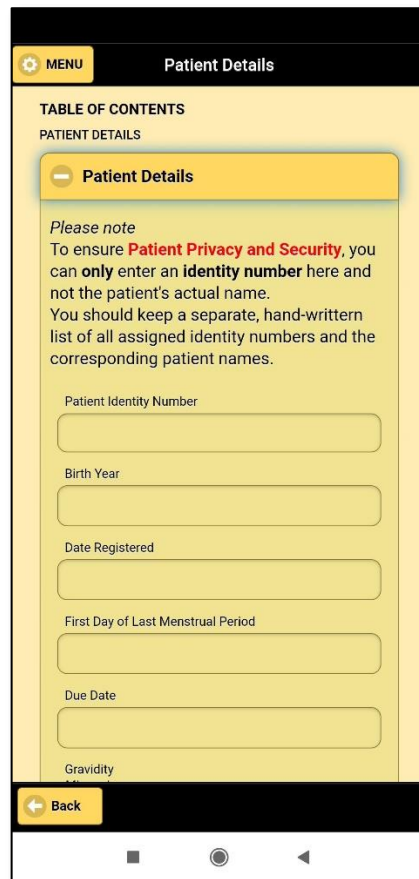
